Non-US Jurisdictions

Scope

This is the Privacy Notice of the Neon Exchange AG (hereinafter "Nash" and/or "We"), a company duly incorporated under the Laws of Liechtenstein. Nash is a fintech company using blockchain as infrastructure for the digital finance space. Our products form an integrated financial services platform that is fully non-custodial. Users can invest in, trade and make payments with digital assets and at no point will Nash control their funds.

Data protection is of a particularly high priority for us. The use of our Website (https://nash.io, hereafter the "Website") is possible without any indication of personal data; however, if you want to use our services, processing of personal data could become necessary. If the processing of personal data is necessary and there is no statutory basis for such processing, we generally obtain consent from you.

The processing of personal data, such as your name, address, e-mail address or telephone number (hereinafter "Data"), shall always be in line with the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and in accordance with the country-specific data protection regulations applicable to Nash.

When you access our Website and/or use our Services, you acknowledge that you have read this Privacy Notice and understand its contents. Your use of our Services and any dispute over privacy is subject to this Privacy Notice and our User Agreement for non-US jurisdictions (including any applicable limitations on damages and the resolution of disputes).

Collection of Data

We collect and process data about you when you provide it to us, when other sources provide it to us or when you use our services.

Nash Account

You have the possibility of registering for a Nash Account on the Website, which involves the indication of Data. Which Data is transmitted to us is determined by the respective input mask used for the registration of a Nash Account. All Data entered by you is collected and stored exclusively for internal use by Nash and for our own purposes. We may request transfer to one or more processors (e.g. a Provider) that also uses Data for an internal purpose. Such use of the Data is attributable to Nash.

Nash Mobile ("the App")

Nash Mobile is available via app platforms operated by third parties, so-called app stores (e.g. Google Play and the Apple App Store). The download may therefore require prior registration with the respective app store. Nash has no influence on the processing of your data in connection with your registration and use of these app stores. The operator of the respective app store is solely responsible in this respect. If necessary, please contact the respective app store operator directly for further information.

For some features, Nash Mobile must be able to access certain interfaces and data on your device. Depending on which operating system you are using, this may require your explicit permission.

Other Sources

In addition to the Data with which you provide us directly, we may also collect data by indirect means or receive it from third parties. Such data includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- Information from our other Services, such as:
 - Transaction Data, which includes information about the type of virtual financial assets that are involved in the transactions you implement on and through the Website and the Services, including order volume, price, value, your trading and transaction history, and the payments that we receive from you.
 - Portfolio Information, which includes information about the virtual financial assets credited to your Account and Wallet and the balances associated with your Account and Wallet.

- Connection Information, which includes information about your internet connection, the equipment you use to access the Website and the Services and usage details.
- Email Communications. To make our email more relevant to you, we may include a web beacon or other tools that provide us with a confirmation that you have opened an email that we have sent to you, if your computer supports such features. We may also compare our user list with lists that we receive from other sources, to avoid sending duplicate or unnecessary messages to our customers. You can adjust your communication preferences by contacting Nash via email at support@nash.io.
- Comments and User Content. - Information from banks, insurance companies, distributors and other contractual partners of ours on the use or provision of services by you (e.g. payments made/purchases made); as well as
- References for applications.

Use of Data and Legal Basis

We process the Data collected in order to guarantee the performance of our Services or for contract processing, invoicing and communication purposes. The processing of Data is also necessary for the fulfilment of legal obligations and lies in our legitimate interest. Furthermore, we process personal data, as far as permitted and necessary, for the following purposes, in particular but not limited to those in which we (and also third parties) have a legitimate interest corresponding to the purpose:

- Providing our products and services, including the Nash Exchange, Funds Management, Nash Extension, Nash Mobile and Nash Pay, and improving them over time;
- Allowing you to download and purchase products and services;
- Personalizing and managing our relationship with you, including introducing you to products or services that may be of interest to you or providing customer support;
- Investigating, responding to, and managing inquiries or events;
- Working with and responding to law enforcement and regulators; and
- Researching matters relating to our business, such as security threats and vulnerabilities.

Where you have given your consent to the processing of your Data, we will process the Data within the Scope of, and based on, your consent to the contents of this Privacy Notice, insofar as we have no other legal basis. Given consent can be revoked for the future at any time.

Data Transfer to Third Parties and Trans-Border Data Flows

As part of our business activities, we may disclose Data to third parties (such as Providers, authorities and other business partners) in Liechtenstein, Switzerland, the EU or other countries for the purposes set out in this Privacy Notice and where appropriate. We may also be required to disclose Data in order to comply with legal or regulatory requirements.

If we transfer Data to a country without adequate legal data protection, we ensure an adequate level of protection by means of data transfer agreements (namely, on the basis of the so-called standard contractual clauses of the European Commission). We also may rely on the statutory exceptions of consent, contract and mandate processing, the establishment, exercise or enforcement of legal claims, overriding public interests, published personal data, or do so because it is necessary to protect your integrity. Duration of Storage

We will process and store the Data only for the period necessary to achieve the purpose of storage, or as far as this is granted by the European legislator or other legislators responsible for laws or regulations to which Nash is subject to.

If the storage purpose is not applicable, or if a storage period prescribed by the European legislator or another competent legislator expires, personal data are routinely blocked or erased in accordance with legal requirements.

Use of our Website

Each time you access our Website, our system automatically collects data and information from the computer system of the accessing computer. The following data is collected:

- Information about the browser type and the version used;
- The User's operating system;
- · The IP address of the User;
- Date and time of access:
- Websites from which the User's system accesses our Website;
- Page viewed on the Website.

The IP addresses are stored in the log files of our system.

Purposes of data processing and legal basis

The temporary storage of the IP address by the system is necessary to enable delivery of the Website to the User's computer. For this purpose, the IP address must remain stored for the duration of the session.

The data is stored in log files to ensure the functionality of the Website. The data is also used to optimize the Website and to ensure the security of our information technology systems. Our legitimate interest in data processing also lies in these purposes.

Cookies

The Website uses cookies. Through the use of cookies, we can provide you with more user-friendly services that would not be possible without the cookie setting. Cookies are text files that are stored in a computer system via an Internet browser. By means of a cookie, the information and offers on our Website can be optimized with the user in mind.

You may, at any time, prevent the setting of cookies through our Website by means of a corresponding setting of the Internet browser used and may thus permanently deny the setting of cookies. Furthermore, cookies already set may be deleted at any time via an Internet browser or other software programs. This is possible in all popular Internet browsers. Google Analytics

On our Website we use Google Analytics, a web analysis service provided by Google Inc. ("Google"). Google Analytics uses cookies, which are saved on your computer and which enable an analysis of the use of the Website. If individual pages of our Website are accessed, the following data is stored:

- (1) The IP address of the User's calling system;
- (2) The accessed website;
- (3) The website from which the User has accessed the accessed website (referrer);
- (4) The sub-pages accessed from the accessed website;
- (5) The time spent on the website;
- (6) The frequency with which the website is accessed.

As far as legally permitted, IP addresses are not stored completely and are only processed further in abbreviated form.

The information generated by Google's cookies about your use of this website is usually transferred to a Google server in the USA and stored there. On our behalf, Google will use this information to evaluate your use of our Website, to compile reports on website activity and to provide us with other services relating to the Website. Google will shorten the User's IP address within member states of the European Union or in other signatory states to the Agreement on the European Economic Area prior to transmission. Only in exceptional cases will the full IP address be transmitted to a Google server in the USA and shortened there. To provide you with services and to communicate with you. Our primary goal

device you are using to access the Website. We may use your history, for
example, to recommend certain content to you.

We also use the information that we collect to provide you with the services that you've requested, such as allowing you to access or submit content and to initiate any transactions. Furthermore, we may also use your information to monitor the usage of our Website and Services, investigate any suspected fraudulent transactions, collect and recover money as may be appropriate, to establish and verify your identity, to detect, prevent and report fraudulent or suspicious orders and transactions, and to conduct automated and manual security checks of our Website and Services.

Subject to Section XVI of the User Agreement for the United States, we also use your personally identifiable information to contact and communicate with you. For instance, we use your information to provide you with legal notices.

We may also use information about you and your activities on the Website or the Services to send you offers, promotions and information that may be of interest to you. Subject to Section XVI of the User Agreement for the Unites States, if you do not wish to receive such communications, you can adjust your communication preferences by contacting Nash via email at support@nash.io.

To improve the Website and the Services. We may do research into our users' demographics, interests and the ways they use the Website and the Services. In doing these analyses, we may use the personally identifiable information that you provide to us in addition to the data from our server log files or from surveys. This research allows us to understand our users better and to improve our products and services. We may share aggregated, de-identified data with advertisers or

other businesses. We may also match user information with third-party data, subject to the terms of confidentiality agreements. For example, we may use information from other companies to customize certain services to your geographic area based upon your IP address.

- To comply with various AML/KYC requirements. We collect and process AML/KYC data about you in order to:
 - comply with legal and regulatory obligations;
 - o conduct our AML and KYC checks, and other diligence checks;
 - verify your identity or claimed identity and identify or verify your source of funds:
 - o make an informed decision on whether we want to enter into a contract with you, and if so, to conduct initial and ongoing screening; and
 - o comply with any legal or regulatory obligation that we may have or any Court, regulatory, or enforcement order that may be issued upon us.
- To comply with legal obligations. We may use the data and information we collect from you, particularly the transaction data and financial information, for legal, tax, and accounting purposes and to fulfill any mandatory reporting obligations that we may have.
- 6. How Do We Share the Information We Receive? Nash is not in the business of selling your personally identifiable information to others. We share the information that you provide only with our affiliated entities, to vendors that provide services under contracts with us (such as financial institutions), to complete your transactions, to enforce or apply other terms of the User Agreement and the Trading Rules, to provide you with services you've requested, or for other purposes in accordance with this Privacy Policy.

Unless otherwise stated in this Privacy Policy or at the time of collection, our policy is that we will not sell, rent, share or authorize any third party to use your email address or any information that personally identifies you without giving you prior notice. In the future, we may buy, merge or partner with or be acquired by other companies or businesses, including a sale of assets pursuant to a court-approved sale under US Bankruptcy law. In connection with such a transaction or transactions, we may include your information among the transferred assets. We may also share your information, in anonymized form, in connection with a prospective buyer or seller of our business or assets.

We may also share information about our users and customers in aggregate or deidentified form, and nothing in this Privacy Policy restricts our use of aggregated or deidentified information in any way.

Please note that it may be necessary to disclose your personal information and your optout preferences to third parties to allow them to remove or suppress your name from future solicitations.

In addition, we may use or share your information in the following circumstances:

 Service providers. We have contracts with third parties to provide services on our behalf, such as fiat currency conversions, fraud protection or credit risk reduction, debt recovery, email distribution, list processing, analytics and promotions. We provide these service providers with only the information that they need to perform their services, and we have written agreements that prohibit them from using this information in any other way, or sharing or reselling the information.

- Legal process and other special circumstances. We may disclose your information, including personally identifiable information, in response to a request from law enforcement, a subpoena, or a court order, or when we may otherwise be required by law or regulation. We may also disclose or use your personally identifiable information in special cases when we have a good faith belief that disclosing or using this information may be necessary to (1) identify, contact, or bring legal action against someone who may be violating the User Agreement or Trading Rules; or (2) protect our rights or property, including protecting against the misuse or unauthorized use of the Website or the Services; or (3) protect the personal safety or property of other users of the Website or the Services or the public.

We will retain your personal information for as long as necessary to fulfill the purposes for which we collected it (i.e., the ongoing provision of our Services) and, thereafter, for the purpose of satisfying any legal, accounting, tax and reporting requirements or obligations to which we may be subject and/or to the extent that we may also need to retain your personal data to be able to assert, exercise or defend possible future legal claims against or otherwise involving you.
- 10. How Do We Protect Your Information? Nash has implemented commercially reasonable physical, technical and administrative controls and procedures to protect the information that we collect. We work hard to protect you and our systems from unauthorized access, but, unfortunately, no method of storage or transmission over the Internet can be 100% secure, and we cannot guarantee that your information will not be accessed, disclosed, altered or destroyed by breach of any of our physical, technical or managerial safeguards.
- 11. How Do You Review or Change Your Personal Information? If you would like to review, update or delete the personally identifiable, company or AML/KYC information that you have provided to us, please send an email to support@nash.io or contact us by mail and we will provide you with a summary of that information. This provision does not apply to information that we collect automatically from your device or browser, as described in Section 2 above. You may also review and change certain information by logging into your Account on the Website and updating such information on your Account. However, we may not be able to delete some of your information without also deleting your Account and limiting your access to certain features of the Services.
